2009 BREEDERS' STAKES - SIRE'S DIVISION

1. Open to all Sires who are presently enrolled in the Super Stakes. To enroll a sire in the Breeders' Stakes for the 2009 season, it must also be enrolled in the Super Stakes for the 2009 season.
2. Placement Fee: \$1,000.
3. Sire Owner or Pup Owner has the right to certify all pups from this sire to compete in the Breeders' Stakes Sire's Division. Pups will earn the right to compete for all awards by being one of the top ten (10) pups sired by his sire.
4. All awards from this program will be paid 80% to the owner of the pup and 20% to the Sire Owner.
5. The pup owner may certify pups before they are six (6) months of age for \$100 each, or before twelve (12) months of age for \$300 each, or before eighteen (18) months old for \$500 each.
6. Pups may be replaced by paying the appropriate certification fee provided the replacement pup is not over twelve (12) months of age.
7. Certification fees and sire placement fees will form the Sires' Division purse which will be paid as follows:
 - a. Twenty percent (20%) of the available purse will be paid to qualified cast winners as a one-year-old. Pup may qualify for both the Sire's Division purse, as well as, the Breeder's Division purse. A cast win will count for awards in both divisions.
 - b. Thirty percent (30%) of the available purse will be paid to qualified cast winners as a two-year-old. Pup may qualify for both the Sire's Division purse, as well as, the Breeder's Division purse. A cast win will count for awards in both divisions.
 - c. Fifty percent (50%) of the available purse will be paid in a championship as a two-year-old.
8. To qualify for the cast win purse a pup must have five (5) cast wins per year, pups owners will be paid their share of the purse at the end of the year. All awards will be paid to the registered owner of the pup at the time the award is due and the recorded owner of the sire at the time of birth of the litter.
9. To qualify to compete in the championship a pup must have earned a minimum of \$1,000 in open lifetime awards and be one of the top ten (10) open event money winners sired by his sire.
10. Championship to be conducted shortly after the fall two-year-old Super Stakes. A pup may be qualified and compete in both the Breeder's and Sire's championships.
